

Message From the Board

It is my pleasure to report that in 2025 the BC Mission Boat Society Board of Directors and staff remained steadfast in their commitment to our Mission, Vision, and Values. This dedication reflects the mission's strong confessional foundation and our shared desire to faithfully serve the Lord and the First Nations communities entrusted to us.

During the past year we were grateful to meet our mission trip goals, serving the communities of Ehattesaht, Klemtu, Kingcome, and Gold River. We were also honoured to participate in the School District Potlatch in Ehattesaht and to support a women's quilting retreat in the community. These opportunities allowed us to strengthen relationships and continue sharing Christ's love in practical ways.

At the same time, the Board worked to prepare for the future of the mission. We reviewed and updated our strategic plan, strengthened policies and procedures, and completed the move of our office back to Vancouver Island so we can be closer to the communities we serve. We also continued working alongside Lutheran Church–Canada and partner ministries to support the expansion of Word and Sacrament ministry among First Nations communities.

Looking ahead to 2026, we are encouraged by new opportunities to serve. In addition to continuing work in our current communities, we have received invitations to bring mission teams to MMFN Gold River, Ahousaht, and Bella Bella, with exploratory visits planned for Bella Coola and Anahim Lake. We pray that God will guide these efforts and open the doors for meaningful ministry.

Our mission depends on faithful people. We are grateful for our dedicated staff—Sonja Bland (Mission Coordinator), Marie Gravel (Mission Administrator), and Nicolas Goerz (summer vicarage student)—as well as Julie Klassen, who continues to support the mission as a consultant. God willing, we look forward to filling the Mission Leader role in 2026 to provide pastoral leadership and vision for the work ahead.

We are thankful that the mission remains financially stable, and we extend heartfelt thanks to our donors and sponsors whose generosity sustains this ministry. As we continue to grow and fill key staff positions, ongoing support will remain essential.



More than 20 children. We were invited to attend the school district Potlatch held in Ehattesaht in May. It was a blessing to serve them in the kitchen and experience the culture.

We were blessed further by the arrival of our summer student Nicolas and his family. They travelled to all the communities together and served with such grace.

We visited the communities of Kyuquot, Klemtu and Kingcome. All teams enjoyed easy travel, warm welcomes and the common feeling of sadness of having to leave so soon.

In the fall, we served community members at a funeral by assisting in the kitchen and serving

Volunteers remained at the heart of the mission. Teams from Quesnel, Prince George, and Vancouver Island supported ministry in Ehattesaht and began renewing connections with the communities of Bella Coola, Anahim Lake, and Bella Bella. We are grateful for the leadership and hands-on involvement of board members and volunteers alike, whose commitment continues to shape and strengthen the mission.

In February, a women's retreat was held at Camp Homewood on Quadra Island. Despite challenging coastal weather, 25 women attended with the support of 35 volunteers. Through the leadership of speaker and music leader Jennifer Kerr, participants were encouraged with the reminder that even in seasons of grief, joy in Christ remains possible.

We also give thanks for our partnership with St. Paul Lutheran Church in Chilliwack, which enabled the distribution of 80 Advent kits to children and families in the communities visited last summer. Behind the scenes, important work supported the mission's sustainability. A covered trailer was purchased to improve storage and organization for summer ministry, and technical systems were strengthened. In October, Marie-Josée Gravel joined BCMBS as Mission Administrator, contributing to a more stable and effective office environment. The board also gathered in person for prayer, fellowship, and focused work on bylaws and policies.

We look ahead with gratitude for God's provision and confidence that, through the people He continues to call and equip, this mission will carry on in faithful service.


